

COMMEMORATIVE TREES

In 2006 a Turner's oak was planted in the park to mark the Queen's 80th birthday. It died several years later and was replaced by a Tulip tree.



THE ROSEHILL CEDAR

The cedar was planted by Mrs Elizabeth Richards who lived on the Rosehill Estate between 1802 and 1837. In 2013, Reading Borough Council deemed the magnificent tree unsafe. it was felled and a replacement planted (circled).



ENVIRONMENTAL CAMPAIGNING

In 2007 EGRA helped the residents of Grove Road campaign for unsafe and dying trees in Grove Road to be replaced. This was done by Reading Borough Council early 2008.
