Planning

South Oxfordshire's Local Plan is entering its final stages. Following the public inquiry, the Inspector's modifications have been published and are being considered by the Council. The news is broadly good in that no major development is proposed close to the Caversham boundary, and we shall of course continue to monitor the position.

The application for up to 260 new homes on the **Reading Golf Club** site has been withdrawn. A re-submission seems likely, and if you commented on the previous application please bear in mind that your comments will not be carried forward automatically: if you want your views to be heard, you will need to comment again quoting the new reference number. We will let you know when a new application is submitted.

An outline application has been submitted for a huge town centre site at **Station Hill**, proposing a mix of retail, leisure and residential uses. CADRA will be taking a look and commenting if appropriate.

Chazey Wood

This is a lovely woodland near Caversham and is much enjoyed by local people, especially at bluebell time. Postings on social media suggest that the operator of the adjacent paintball centre plans to extend that use throughout the wood, using 'BB guns', and that public access would be excluded. The operator apparently confirms this intention on Facebook. If this is so, it raises big issues of rights of way, impact on the environment, and planning permission. We are attempting to find out the position and will comment appropriately.

Crime

Continuing the woodland theme, the Police are keen to hear of the abuse of local woodlands by off-road motor bikes. You may recall that the daughter of one of our committee members was seriously injured when her horse was spooked in this way. If you spot such an incident, report it to Thames Valley Police using their <u>Report a Crime</u> form.

There has been a worrying number of other incidents around Caversham, but it is encouraging that arrests have been made. The police rely heavily on reports from the community and urge you to report any incidents on 101 or online. In an emergency or if a crime is being committed, call 999. Your reports are important for the deployment of resources to tackle crime. The police particularly request that we do not give money to beggars.

Surveys

We have been asked to pass on some worthwhile survey requests to you.

Reading Healthwatch is consulting on priorities for the area's Health and Wellbeing Strategy. You will be asked to rank 11 competing priorities and there is an incentive of £100 in shopping vouchers for a random participant. <u>Health and Wellbeing Strategy - Have Your Say</u>

New Ways of Being in Touch with Your GP Surgery

There is a questionnaire targeting mainly people over 50, about new ways of communicating with their GP or other staff at their local surgery. It seeks to understand how patients feel about these new methods.

The survey covers all of Reading and is being carried out by the South Reading Patient Voice Group, an organisation of local people and patients interested in health and health services. Anonymised results will be reported to the local NHS, Reading Borough Council and other public organisations for the purpose of improving GP services for older people. <u>New Ways of Being in Touch</u>
