Membership Secretary

Open Meetings

We are very grateful to John Painter for his excellent talk on Reading Abbey and Reading Gaol. Our two online events reached over 180 people. If you were not able to join, you may be interested in a <u>WEA Day Course on</u> <u>Reading Abbey</u> on Saturday 16 October.

We are reviewing options for an open meeting in the autumn, either in person or online.

Planning

Changes in planning law continue as we anticipate what the <u>Government's proposed planning bill</u> may bring. From 1 August 2021 new <u>Permitted Development Rights</u> were introduced. These allow change of use from commercial, business or services to residential. Only a light touch application for prior approval is required and this also applies within Conservation Areas.

The application for housing on **Reading Golf Club** was considered by the Planning Committee in July. KEG, EGRA and CADRA spoke to raise concerns and the committee voted unanimously to refuse. Adjacent to the building work for **82 care units on Henley Road**, there are plans for another 60 retirement apartments. The application number is <u>210975</u>, CADRA is reviewing the plans and would welcome comments. We worked with the previous owners of the **Priory Avenue Surgery** to achieve a conversion to apartments which would preserve the exceptional Arts and Crafts interior. The wonderful stained-glass window will remain, but sadly a revised application has been approved which removes the original staircase. Council Consultations
