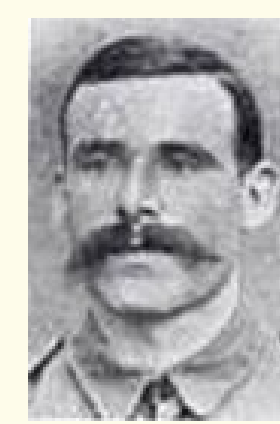

In many houses in Lower Caversham, wives or mothers of enlisted men placed a printed card in their front windows with the inscription:

Serving King, Home, and Empire.

The cards were thought to be an incentive to recruitment as they would show houses which had not contributed members to the armed forces and would make them feel unpatriotic.
